

WHAT ARE PASSION PROJECTS?

- 1. Passion projects are personal initiatives undertaken to address a specific local or global issue. They play a vital role in personal and community development, allowing Inspire volunteers to contribute meaningfully to causes they care about and be catalysts and inspirations for positive change.
- 2. Inspire volunteers take their experiences and learnings gained from their volunteer trip abroad and channel that into initiating meaningful community initiatives.
- 3. Passion projects can range from supporting existing projects and organizations, to starting an initiative to tackle a cause important to the volunteer.







- Launched post-Inspire Trip project supporting Uyghur refugees.
- Conducted interviews in Turkey, Canada, and USA for a newcomer support manual.
- Presented findings at Calgary conference, engaging policymakers and settlement agencies.
- Initiated English teaching passion project for Uyghur refugees in Turkey, accumulating 100+ volunteering hours.

ENVER SUBHANI:

PREPARING CANADA FOR UYGHUR REFUGEES & TEACHING UYGHUR REFUGEES IN TÜRKIYE ENGLISH



- Founded Palestinian Cultural Club at Toronto Metropolitan University, leading various awareness events and booths on global catastrophes, including Moroccan, Libyan, and Afghan earthquakes, and the Gaza genocide.
- Initiated Kuffiyeh United, an international movement for Gaza solidarity, involving over 5000 participants, raising \$50,000 through Kuffiyeh Week, garnering media coverage.
- Organized Voices for Palestine, a successful panel with 500 attendees, motivating leaders to replicate it at other universities. Also addressed anti-Palestinian hate on campus through a viral video, an open letter, and protests. Held a vigil for communal reflection, featuring personal stories from a Gazaborn UofT professor and an indigenous woman married to a Palestinian.

- Founded MILO Canada, advocating for global health during and beyond the pandemic, including Project India distributing \$2K worth of COVID-19 kits, MILO Soccer League promoting cross-cultural understanding, and a YouTube channel for inclusivity.
- Started Good Will Initiative, raising \$3,200+ and dedicating 1000+ hours for PPE and supplies to the homeless in Ottawa, providing 21,000+ items and 830+ sanitation kits, along with 250+ meals served.
- Inspired by volunteer experiences in South Africa and Bosnia, addressing mental health, rebuilding infrastructure, and supporting orphans, accumulating a total of 2524 combined volunteer hours for MILO Canada and 1000+ hours for GWI.

- "Little Hearts, Big Dreams" initiative nurtures Islamic education for toddlers:
- Conducted sports activities and established an Islamic program for ages 0-5 at the mosque.
- Weekly playgroup fosters community connections for children (0-6 years old).
- Collaborating with the mosque on plans for an Islamic elementary school and daycare.
- Volunteering abroad experience with Inspire instilled empathy and inspired community support.
- Over 200 hours dedicated to these initiatives.

Total volunteering hours dedicated to these initiatives exceed 200.

MAHMOUD DIEF:

NURTURING ISLAMIC EDUCATION FOR TODDLERS AND BEYOND



- Invited to join NCCM for the first Foreign Affairs Advocacy Day on Parliament Hill as one of the delegates. It was an opportunity for Canadian Muslim leaders, thinkers, and activists to get together and advocate with one strong voice about the issues that matter to their communities by engaging in discussions directly with ministers, MPs, and leaders from all of Canada's major parties.
- The main focus for that year was policy recommendations surrounding Uyghur forced labour in East Turkestan (Xinjiang).
- September 2022 Engaged in a full day of advocacy meetings and discussions. Ashad saw this as an ideal opportunity to voice the experiences and stories of the children and families he interacted with on his Inspire trip to Turkiye to people in positions of power and influence, who had the ability to enact real change.
- March 2023 There was a positive response to the advocacy efforts of all involved. The government of Canada committed to passing legislation that would eradicate goods tainted by forced labour from supply chains, including those arising from Uyghur concentration camps.

- Omar created Ruh, a Canada-wide online therapy platform offering accessible, culturally responsive, and faith-sensitive mental health care.
- His team of licensed Muslim therapists come from diverse ethnic backgrounds and are available to support individuals, children (ages 3+), couples, and families.
- Ruh offers support through text, voice, or video in multiple languages, including English, Arabic, French, Hindi, Urdu, Punjabi, and Creole. Their strong multidisciplinary team includes Registered Psychotherapists, Registered Social Workers, and Psychiatrists with various areas of specialization.
- Ruh is committed to empowering their clients to navigate life's challenges by providing comprehensive mental health care throughout their unique journeys of healing and growth.

OMAR KHAN:

PROVIDING ACCESSIBLE, CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE, MENTAL HEALTH CARE.



- After his inspire trip, Fayzan took part in starting up an Islamic Relief club at the University of Western.
- They partnered with Charity Week and their MSA in their first semester of operations, and were able to raise \$27,000 for the cause.
- Auctioned off a jar of dollar store olives for over \$13,000
- The club has also run several events, and all proceeds have gone to a certain fundraising campaign of IRC. They did tote bag painting for Syria, mug painting for Sudan, and bake sales at a Masjid for Gaza where they raised over \$1,000. Next semester, they plan to run many events, including a year-end fundraising dinner.
- Fayzan plans to be an executive member of Western IRC throughout his undergrad.
- This winter, he volunteered at RIS with IRC in multiple fundraising shifts where all proceeds went to Gaza, and he also operated the Relief Collective shop for a few shifts as well.

FAYZAN KAMAL:

CHANGEMAKER AND COMMUNITY LEADER WITH IRC



- Ouswa attended a panel discussion on Uyghur rights titled "From Campus to Parliament: Uyghur Rights and Justice." The panel featured an Uyghur activist and a Member of Parliament, who shared their journeys advocating for Uyghurs and other Turkic Muslims.
- She intention was to gain insights into becoming a better advocate.

 During the panel, Ouswa shared her experiences in Turkiye, which led to establishing a connection with an MP, and she had the opportunity to meet the president of the International Support for Uyghurs organization. She signed up as a volunteer with them.
- Ouswa joined the Montreal regional team.
- Member of SPHR (Solidarity for Palestinian Human Rights). Alongside the team, she actively advocated for Palestinian rights, organized fundraisers, and successfully collected over \$23,000. These donations were directed through Islamic Relief.

- As a Lead of Edmonton Namal Chapter, Aisha and her team organized a fundraiser in Dec 2023 and collected around \$70,000 for the project 'Free education for rural youth of Pakistan'
- She volunteered for the non profit Justice For All Canada in raising funds for Gaza and Palestine, as well as advocating for the cause.
- As the Advisory Board Director of the non profit organization in Canada, called 'Jaza Relief', Aisha led her team to raise awareness about impoverished and vulnerable communities, and raised funds for programming that assists them.
- As Chairperson of MAD, Multivision and Diversity Association of Canada, she organized an awareness event about Islamic Relief Canada, where she discussed different global initiatives undertaken by the organization.

- After her Inspire trip, she became the co-president of the Islamic Relief club at McMaster university. she told her executive team about her Inspire experience and made it a goal for the year to to increase advocacy for important humanitarian causes, specifically within the McMaster student population.
- Since September 2023, her team has planned 5 events: a Krispy Kreme sale, a bake sale, a relief collective merch sale, a chai and chill, and a girls night in. Through these events, they raised over \$4000 for Islamic relief causes, and will continue to fundraise until the end of the school year.
- Launching of a new general member team, to give more individuals in the community a chance to develop their leadership skills. The general members will be tasked with choosing a cause that is important to them and creating a crowdfunding page where they choose a fundraising goal and try to reach it. They will also be given opportunities to assist with IR McMaster events, and volunteer in the community.
- This project is important to Sara because she noticed that many people wanted to be involved with Islamic Relief, however there were only a limited number of executive roles. This makes being involved more accessible, and gives individuals a chance to build up their skills, and pursue more leadership opportunities in the future.

- Jude presented in front of her colleagues and supervisors at her PhD Laboratory in December on her experience in Bosnia.
- She sent them readings in advance on the impact of Bosnia's genocide on mental health to situate the historical context. The presentation was 2.5h long with a discussion at the end.
- One of her goals is to research PTSD and resilience among genocide survivors of Bosnia in the future, and perhaps organize mental health initiatives for Bosnians. She also aims to be involved with the Doctors Without Borders team and assist regions (including Bosnia) who have witnessed violence, war, trauma, and genocide.
- She is working with colleagues on starting up a new NGO that will provide medical and mental health support at the local and international level.

 One of their hopes is to provide medical and psychological services in the middle east, Africa, and Bosnia.
